**Principals' Message:
Calm, Alert and Engaged Learners**

With the start of the New Year, we often think about goals and resolutions. We ask what do we want to focus on this year to have a happier and healthier life? At Maywood, we work together to set goals for our students to improve their learning. For the 2017-2018 school year the focus continues to be on creating calm, alert and engaged learners. You may have noticed changes in your child's classroom environment. Teachers have been working on redesigning their classrooms to create a calm and peaceful atmosphere where kids have choices for where they work and play. Many classrooms have a mindful space within the classroom where students can go to calm their bodies and their minds. We are also looking for ways to get kids more engaged in learning through the integration of ADST (applied design skills and technology) projects in the curriculum.

This is one of the areas of the redesigned curriculum that aims to prepare students for the world today by teaching them to design and create prototypes using different technologies. You will see our students coding, building, weaving, sewing, drafting and using robotics. We also know that kids are more engaged in learning when they have time to learn in the outdoors. Many classes have outdoor explorations at Maywood and at local parks. Other classes will be spending time planting and nurturing our garden. Our whole school will be going on a field trip to explore nature and learn together outside. Student Learning Page

In January, we started to learn about weaving. We had an assembly with an elder named Alice Guss. Miss Guss talked about the Coast Salish people and she told us about the blankets that they make. She also told us about the story of the turtle. The story was about a turtle who had an idea to go south with the birds. The turtle was biting a stick and the birds were holding it while they flew. The birds kept saying it was their idea but it was the turtle's idea. The turtle got mad and said it was his idea and when he opened his mouth, he fell and cracked his shell. The moral of the story is to keep your mouth shut, don't interrupt and don't always try to be right.

Now we are working with our big buddies in Mr. Sanderson's class to weave a big blanket. We chose four colours to start. Then we chose one more for the middle. We had to weave it together. First we learned how to twine and then we did over and under. We learned the same way that the Coast Salish People learned. It was hard work but we felt proud. Our big buddies helped to teach us. We are so excited to learn more about how to weave!

When we talked to our big buddies, we said:

"Weaving is hard but fun."

"It's fun because you can teach your buddy how to make it."

"You can do one half, your buddy can do the other half."

"You have to make it precise."


"It can be different colours but you shouldn't cut the sides or it will fall apart."

"It makes a pattern when you go over and under."

"It's something that was very interesting to some cultures."

"My big buddy is helpful."

"I feel calm when I weave."

Fundraise to help the hungry, homeless and hurting in Burnaby


Feel a hint of the challenge faced by those experiencing homelessness during winter




