Principal's Message: Our School Plan

This year we are focusing our teaching, resources and professional learning on two school plan goals.

Goal One is a continuation from last year: To increase students' ability to solve problems peacefully. We are learning about the STEPs for solving problems and how to apply them to real life conflicts.

S = say the problem

T = think of solutions

E = explore consequences

P = pick the best solution

We are learning about our own triggers and how to avoid getting upset. We are learning to see problems from other perspectives and to think about others before ourselves.

Families can support students with this goal by:

- Talking about the STEPs for solving problems and applying them to problems
- Talking about the things that trigger us and how we can get back to a calm place
- Ask your child to think about conflicts from different perspectives


Goal Two: To increase students' ability to think deeply about the books that they read.

We are learning strategies to help us understand what we read before, during and after reading. Teachers provide reading instruction through whole class discussions, small group work and individual reading conferences. Students are learning to make predictions and connections, to question and make inferences, to summarize and synthesize. Most importantly, we are trying to engage students in reading by helping them find books that they are interested in.

Families can support students with this goal by:

- Reading to your child or listening to your child read on a daily basis
- Ensuring that there are lots of books in your home by visiting the public library, exchanging books with another family or taking advantage of sales at local book stores.
- Talking to your child and asking them 5W questions as they read (who, what, where, when, why)
- Celebrate reading as a family by reading together and talking about books you love to read


